CAP. XXVI.

An act for the better preventing the counterfeiting the current coin of this kingdom.

THEREAS notwithstanding the good laws still in force against the counterfeiting of the monies and coins of this realm, yet the faid offence doth and is like daily to increase, to the manifest wrong and injury both of his Majesty and all his loving subjects, being very much occasioned for want of a due and condign punishment to be inflicted. upon such artificers and others, who without any lawful authority do make or use puncheons, stamps, dyes, and other engines and instruments, which are commonly used, or may be made use of, in or about the coining of money: for redress of which so great and growing a mischief, be it enacted by the King's most excellent majesty, by and with the advice and confent of the lords spiritual and temporal, and commons, in this present parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same. That from and after the fifteenth day of May, one thousand fix hundred ninety seven, no smith, ployed in the engraver, founder, or other person or persons whatsoever (other mint, &c. shall than and except the persons employed or to be employed in or for his Majesty's mint or mints in the tower of London, or elsewhere, and for the use and service of the said mints only, or perions lawfully authorized by the lords commissioners of the treaof gold or filfury, or lord high treasurer of England for the time being) shall ver, nor make knowingly make or mend, or begin or proceed to make or mend, tool, &c. nor or affift in the making or mending of any puncheon, counter coining preis, puncheon, matrix, stamp, dye, pattern, or mould of steel, iron, filver, or other metal or metals, or of spaud, or fine founders earth, or fand, or of any other materials whatfoever, in or upon which there shall be, or be made or impressed, or which will make or impress the figure, stamp, resemblance or similitude of both or either of the fides or flats of any gold or filver coin, current within this kingdom, nor shall knowingly make or mend, or begin or proceed to make or mend, or affift in the making or mending of any edger or edging tool, instrument, or engine, not of common use in any trade, but contrived for marking of money round the edges with letters, grainings, or other marks or figures refembling those on the edges of money coined in his Majesty's miat, nor any prefs for coinage, nor any cutting engine, for cutting round blanks by force of a screw out of flatted bars of gold, filver, or other metal, nor shall knowingly buy or fell, hide or conceal, or without lawful authority or sufficient excuse for that purpole, knowingly have in his, her or their houses, custody or possession, any such puncheon, counter puncheon, matrix, ftamp, dye, edger, cutting engine, or other tool or in-Offenders, &c. strument before mentioned; and if any smith, engraver, foundguilty of high er, or other person or persons whatsoever, (other than and except as aforefaid) shall offend in any the matters or things aforefald, then all and every such offender and offenders, their coun-

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, or colouring, That if any person or persons whatsoever, after the said fifteenth gilding, &c. day of May, shall colour, gild, or case over with gold or silver, any coin reor with any wash or materials producing the colour of gold or current coin. filver, any coin refembling any the current coin of this kingdom, or any round blanks of base metal, or of coarse gold or coarse filver of a fit fize and figure to be coined into counterfeit milled money refembling any the gold or filver coin of this kingdom, or if any person or persons shall gild over any filver blanks of a fit fize and figure to be coined into pieces refembling the current gold coin of this kingdom, all and every fuch person and persons fo offending, their counfellors, procurers, aiders and abettors, shall be, and is and are hereby adjudged to be guilty of high treason, and being convicted or attainted thereof, according to the order and course of the laws of this realm, shall suffer death as in case of high treason.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That dye, &c. found if any puncheon, dye, ftamp, edger, cutting engine, preis, flask, or other tool, instrument, or engine, used or designed for coining or counterfeiting gold or filver monies, or any part of fuch tool or engine, shall, at any time after the said fifteenth day of May, be hid or concealed in any place, or found in the house. custody, or possession of any person or persons whatsoever, not then employed in the coining of money in some of his Majesty's mints, nor having the same by some lawful authority, that then it shall and may be lawful to and for any person or persons whatsoever, discovering the same, to seize, and he and they are hereby required to seize the same, and to carry them forthwith to fome justice of peace of the county, city, or place where the fame shall be so seized, and by him secured, to be produced in evidence against any person or persons who shall or may be prosecuted for any such offence, in some court of justice proper for the determination thereof, and after such time as they or any of them shall have been produced in evidence, as well the same so produced, as the other so seized, and not made use of in evidence, and every of them, shall forthwith by order of that court where such offender or offenders shall be tried, or by order, and in the presence of such or some other justice of the peace, in case there be no such trial, be totally defaced and destroyed; and if, after the faid fifteenth day of May, any counterfeit or unlawfully diminished money shall be produced in any court of justice, either in evidence against any person or persons for any offence relating to the counterfeiting or unlawfully diminishing of money, or otherwise, that then, or immediately after evidence given, the judge or judges of fuch court shall cause such monies to be cut in pieces in open court, or in the presence of some justice of the peace, and then to be delivered to or for such perfon or persons to whom the same of right shall appertain.

And whereas several mixtures of metals have been invented in imitation of gold and filver, and blanched copper is principally made sale, or mixing use of in imitation of silver, and seldom, if ever, for any bonest or blanched cop-good purpose; be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, per with filver, That if any person or persons whatsoever, after the said fifteenth &c. or taking day of May, shall blanch copper for sale, or mix blanched copper with filver, or knowingly buy or fell, or offer to fale, blanmilled money, ched copper alone, or mixed with filver, or shall knowingly and fraudulently buy or fell, or offer to fale, any malleable compofition or mixture of metals or minerals, which shall be heavier than filver, and look, and touch, and wear like standard gold, but be manifestly worse than standard, or shall take, receive, pay, or put off, any counterfeit milled money, or any milled money whatfoever unlawfully diminished, and not cut in pieces, at or for a lower rate or value than the same by its denomination doth or shall import, or was coined or counterfeited for, that then all and every such person and persons shall be deemed and adjudged cording to the order and course of the laws of this realm, shall

WHEREAS by reason of the many grievous extortions and ill practices of such persons who have for several years past respectively executed the offices of marshal of the King's Bench, warden of the Fleet, and keeper of the Marshalsea, Newgate, and other prifons, and by several pretended privileged places within this realm, both creditors and debtors have been notoriously abused, and the good intents of the law wholly eluded: for reformation thereof be it enacted by the King's most excellent majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the lords spiritual and temporal, and commons, in this present parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, That from and after the first day of May, one thousand Prisoners in fix hundred ninety seven, all prisoners, either upon contempt or the King's
